One man, Alistair, is a killer; the other, Joe, is the brother of the man he killed. One feels he dare not ask for forgiveness; the other feels incapable of giving it. One day a young girl is found dead in an abandoned building and Do-joon is accused of her murder. Bong Joon-ho competed in San Sebastian's Official Selection with his first two movies, *Barking Dogs Never Bite* (2000) and *Memories of Murder* (2003). He has also directed *The Host* (2006). *Mother* was screened as part of Un Certain Regard at the last Cannes Festival.

She can't read or write, and her schoolmates tease her for being fat. Her home life is a horror, ruled by a mother (Mo'Nique) who keeps her imprisoned both emotionally and physically. Precious's instincts tell her one thing: if she's ever going to break from the chains of ignorance, she will have to dig deeply into her own resources. The big hit at Sundance Festival, winner of the Special Jury Prize, Best Actress for Mo'Nique and the Audience Award. Lee Daniels competed in San Sebastian's Zabaltegi-New Directors section with his previous movie *Shadowboxer* (2005).

Three weeks later, Elliot finds himself swept up in a generation-defining experience that would change his life, and the popular culture, forever. A new surprising career twist from the director of *Brokeback Mountain* (2005) and *Sense and Sensibility* (1995).
