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Introduction

The film industry world, and with it, that of film festivals, is changing. The context of digital immediacy, added to the emergence of new technologies and new viewing methods means **that festivals can't just sit around** and watch, simply continuing to provide a selection of good films (with the promotion, business and glamour that goes with them) over a period of a few days.

These changes generated in the 66th edition of the San Sebastian Festival the design and implementation of new activities and new approaches.

- Science, technology and industry. Zinemaldia & Technology. The Festival wants to position itself as a strategic hub for reflection on technology and the audiovisual industry, therefore creating synergies with R&D&I companies in the territory, which are at the leading edge worldwide. This first meeting was co-organised with Tabakalera and Tecnalia, and sponsored by Petronor.
- 2. A Festival lasting all year round. This strategic commitment is impossible to understand without the Festival belonging to the ecosystem of the Tabakalera International Centre for Contemporary Culture, where it shares spaces and projects both with Tabakalera itself and with the Filmoteca vasca. Together we form part of the ecosystem which has created a unique platform, both in Spain and internationally, for the training and professionalising of filmmakers. Together we co-organise the Nest Film Students meeting, together we have created the Ikusmira Berriak programme of residencies and project development, and together we have conceptualised and launched the new Querejeta Zine Eskola film school.

- 3. Signing of the Charter for Parity. In recent years, society has been raising questions on feminist issues, questions that are also overflowing into the audiovisual industry, an industry where positions of responsibility have been and still are mainly occupied by men. After the Charter was signed by the Cannes and Venice Festivals, and with the collaboration of CIMA (the Association of Women Filmmakers and Audiovisual Media), the Festival has undertaken to observe gender parity in its selection and management committees (which is currently the case), to publish them on its website (something we've been doing for years) and to draw up a report on gender statistics at the end of every edition (which the Festival may do from its next edition).
- 4. Image revamp. 2018 was the year the Festival not only adopted a new image for the edition, but a new corporate image too. This change, which involved changing the Festival logo and its different promotional applications, will be defined and consolidated in the coming years with a view to bringing its image up to date with the new times.
- New talents. The Festival continues its strategic commitment to new filmmakers, not only through the Nest Film Students meeting or New Directors, but also by programming a relevant number of first or second films in its Official Selection.

On the other hand, the Festival continues to function as a meeting place for the film industry, in a space where professionals can exchange opinions and experiences and do business.

It is also a space where attendees can watch varied and good films and receive the visit of stars and prestigious filmmakers.

All of this in the year that the Festival enjoyed a record number of accredited visitors and record takings for the films submitted as well as from the rental of advertising hoarding, thereby demonstrating its excellent health.







Muriel Box

Box (Surrey, England, 1905- London, 1991) was characterised throughout the years of her work, from 1945 to 1964, as being a writer and director who tackled complex, taboo subjects including prostitution, child abuse, abortion, illegitimate children or adolescent sex. She had an extremely clairvoyant and brave approach given the social and political context in which said films were made. Her contribution in relation to those subjects played a fundamental role in the British cinema of the fifties and first half of the sixties.

As was the case of North America's Dorothy Arzner – to whom the San Sebastian Festival dedicated a retrospective in 2014 – and Ida Lupino, reviewing her filmography today seems essential in establishing a feminist discourse and vindicating the important role played by women filmmakers in different contexts and cinematographies. Despite enjoying a certain prestige among cinephiles, there are very few studies of her works and barely any mention is made of her in general film histories.

Muriel Box also falls in line with independent cinema despite working with subject matter typical of the classic and popular genres, such as drama, comedy, detective or period films. Her work as a director corresponds to a time of change within British cinema: the days of the Ealing comedies, the work of other independent moviemakers like Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger and the birth of the critical documentary-making which would lead to Free Cinema.

Following the memorable presentation last year of *Lumière! L'aventure* commence (*Lumière! The Adventure Begins*), a screening with comments by the director of the Cannes Festival and of the Lumière Institute, Thierry Frémaux, the San Sebastian Festival and the Lumière Festival in Lyon now open collaboration on what will become a yearly rendezvous with the screening of a restored classic.

The project chosen to launch the initiative Klasikoa is *Ladri di biciclette / Bycicle Thieves* (1948), by Vittorio De Sica, an emblematic film of Italian neorrealism.

The film, considered one of the best movies in the history of cinema, winner of an Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film in 1949, chronicles the misfortunes of a man on his first day at work whose essential element for keeping his job is stolen: his bicycle. André Bazin, in his famous analysis of the film, in his work *What is Cinema?*, describes it as cinema in its pure state and concludes on the subject of the plot: "in the world in which this workman lives, the poor must steal from each other in order to survive."

The film has been restored by the L'imagine Ritrovata laboratory, part of Italy's Fondazione Cineteca di Bologna, a global benchmark in film research, conservation and restoration. The restored copy was presented in the Cannes Classics section at the last Cannes Festival, followed shortly afterwards by its screening at Bologna's Il Cinema Ritrovato Festival, as part of its Ritrovati e Restaurati 2018 / Recovered & Restored 2018 section.

Every year, a film chosen by the Festival and the Lumière Festival will be screened in San Sebastián.

Phantom Thread has been voted Best Film of 2018 by the members of FIPRESCI, the International Federation of Film Critics. The vote was decided by 473 critics from all over the world, who chose this production from among all of the films premiered after 1 July 2017. The other three finalists were Three Billboards Outside Ebbing Missouri by Martin McDonagh (City of Donostia / San Sebastian Audience Award 2017), Zimna wojna / Cold War by Pawel Pawlikowski, Best Director Award in Cannes, programmed this year in Perlak, and Zama, by Lucrecia Martel.

This is the third time that Paul Thomas Anderson will have received the award in San Sebastian. In 2008 he received the accolade for his film *There Will Be Blood* and in 2000, for Magnolia. The North American filmmaker has received the Golden Bear in Berlin for Magnolia, the Best Director Award in Cannes for *Punch-Drunk Love* (2002) and the Silver Bear for Best Director and two Academy Awards with *There Will Be Blood*.

Since its creation in 1999, the Fipresci Grand Prix has gone to highly-acclaimed filmmakers including Pedro Almodóvar, Michael Haneke, Cristian Mungiu, Jean-Luc Godard, Richard Linklater, Roman Polanski, George Miller, Maren Ade and Aki Kaurismäki among others.





Industry Department

The **FESTIVAL'S INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT** provided all industry professionals with the means and activities to make their stay in San Sebastian as productive and satisfactory as possible. It also provided support to teams from the films selected for the Festival: producers, distributors and sales agents.

Located in the Kursaal Centre, The Industry Club space has the necessary installations to optimise the work of its accredited guests. The **industry pass** gives its holders access to the following activities and services:

Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum; Films in Progress; Glocal in Progress; Lau Haizetara Documentary Co-Production Forum; other activities such as presentations, round tables, and services like the borrowing of spaces for professional meetings, access to the online professional area (industry attendees and contacts for the selected films), and a shared work space with Wi-Fi and computers.

In 2018 the number of professionals accredited at the Festival came to 4,144, of whom **1,698 were accredited industry professionals** from 1,163 companies in 63 countries. The presence of these professionals represents a rise of 34.7% compared to 2017 and a sustained increase of more than 72.5% with respect to 2010.

New features in 2018

In this edition, the Industry Department introduced a series of new features to its activities with a view to enabling collaboration between professionals:

The Festival and the ICT

The Festival, Tecnalia, Petronor and Tabakalera joined forces to launch a new annual industry event to promote closer connections between the film world and innovation in ICTs (information and communication technologies). The *Zinemaldia & Technology* event kicked off with an opening talk by the film director Juan Antonio Bayona, and continued with presentations, demonstrations and a networking area on leading-edge technologies such as: blockchain, virtual and mixed reality, neuromarketing and language technologies. Rounding off the event, two panels of guests from public institutions and private companies discussed public-private collaboration and the new opportunities offered by the incorporation of technology to the world of film.

New audiovisual formats

The Industry Department addressed the series phenomenon with two round tables where, with the title of *Narrating in series, a chapter on creation and industry*, participants discussed the increasingly more important role of serial narrations in creativity and production, particularly in Spain, whose works have sold internationally and are now a benchmark in the Spanish-speaking world.

European Film Forum

The San Sebastian Festival organised, jointly with Creative Europe MEDIA, an event dedicated to international film funds, particularly in Europe and Latin America, and their role in promoting co-productions and access to new markets. The event was part of the European Film Forum, the platform for structured dialogue between policy makers and stakeholders in the audiovisual sector set in motion by the European Commission in 2015.

Focus on the Baltics

Focus on is an industry initiative launched in 2014 with the Focus on Canada, when a group of professionals from that country was invited to San Sebastian in collaboration with Telefilm Canada in order to discover the Festival first hand, increase their network of professional contacts and participate in the Industry activities.

In 2018 the *Focus on* was dedicated to the Baltic countries. Thanks to the collaboration of the Estonian Film Institute, the National Film Centre of Latvia and the Lithuanian Film Centre, fifteen producers with projects from Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania attended the Festival to increase their opportunities of co-production with other European and Latin American regions.

Proyecta, a new collaboration project with Ventana Sur

In 2018, collaboration between the San Sebastian Festival and Ventana Sur, Latin America's biggest film market, organised by the Marché du Film-Festival de Cannes and the INCAA (National Institute of Cinema and Audiovisual Arts of Argentina), increased with the launch of PROYECTA, a new collaboration to promote coproductions with and within Latin America.

Festival Film Library

The Film Library service is now exclusively available online and can be used on any notebook. Cinando also offers a free application for iPad users.



VII Europe-Latin America Co-production Forum

September 23, 24, 25 and 26. San Telmo Museum

The Co-Production Forum is a platform for presenting projects at the development stage from Europe and Latin America. The heads of the 17 selected projects presented their work to accredited industry guests at pitching sessions and had a personalised agenda of meetings with the professionals interested in their projects.

The Forum has its headquarters in the San Telmo Museum. The Cloister was set up as a networking area where the industry guests could arrange meetings. It was also the setting for the lunches and Happy Hours laid on for the attendees. The projects presented had an individual space for one-to-one meetings with industry professionals.

As sidebar activities, Conferences, Round tables and Presentations were organised in the Function Room, where professionals exchanged experiences and discussed questions of interest including the latest trends in the audiovisual world, co-productions, distribution and new business models.

VII Europe-Latin America Co-production Forum

Focus on the Baltics

In the framework of the Forum, the Industry Department organises the *Focus on*, an initiative whereby a group of professionals from a country, region or territory come to the San Sebastian Festival to increase their network of professional contacts and participate in the Industry activities.

This year, thanks to the collaboration of the Estonian Film Institute, the National Film Centre of Latvia and the Lithuanian Film Centre, fifteen producers with projects from Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania attended the Festival to increase their opportunities of co-production with other European and Latin American regions.

Advisory services on internationalisation for Basque projects

Yet another year, in collaboration with the Festival, the Creative Europe Desk Euskadi - Zineuskadi organised an advisory service for film projects with an international vocation. An initiative for producers with feature film projects at the development and/or filming stage, giving them a solid starting point for the internationalisation of their projects and the search for new partners at the 66th edition of the Festival.

This year, the advice was provided by Katrin Pors, a Danish producer with long and proven experience in coproductions between Europe and Latin America. Her task was to provide guidance for the selected professionals on the internationalisation of their projects, the search for partners and funding.

It has the principal objective to promote audiovisual creation, articulating its programme around two areas: training and production. Ikusmira Berriak offers a six-week residency for creative development, a grant for starting production and a programme of support for post-production in the shape of an award.

The programme, which celebrated its fourth edition this year, ended with active participation of the project heads in the VII Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum, both for the pitching session on Sunday 23 September and for the one-to-one meetings organised over the following days with professionals interested in their projects.

Europa Distribution

The platform was available from September 21, the Festival opening date, until October 29, exactly a month after it closed. During this period there were **2,696 viewings** (1,525 in 2017).
















