Introduction

In its 67th edition, and for the second consecutive year, the Festival has beaten its own record for audience attendance, accredited guest numbers, takings for films submitted and rental of advertising billboards. This panorama of sustained growth must not however conceal the very hard work that goes into every achievement, not to mention the difficulty of continued growth. The Festival, due to its own characteristics and those of the surroundings in which is located, has been approaching its growth ceiling for years.

Over and above the figures, the Festival's strength is accredited by the fact that its most recent endeavours are very rapidly demonstrating the fittingness of its approach.

In its second edition, **Zinemaldia & Technology**, a strategic proposal by the Festival to shape a benchmark space of reflection on technology applied to audiovisuals and to the industry, has grown in content, in partners and in the interest it arouses.

We have also recently welcomed **the arrival of the second generation at the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola, a film school now forming part of the Festival machinery**. As we explained from the beginning, the idea is not only for the Festival to provide knowledge and contacts to the School, but for the students to contribute to evolution of the Festival as part of essential projects such as research into its archives or the Ikusmira Berriak residencies programme.

The boost given to Ikusmira Berriak and to the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola corresponds to the **Festival's strategic commitment to new talents** and covers the complete path followed by the future filmmakers: from their training at the School, the presentation of their short films in Nest Film Students, the possibility of developing their projects in the residencies programme, of completing their films in the different options offered by the Industry activities and, finally, of being selected for and programmed in New Directors, the section dedicated to the first and second works by their directors, or for the Official Selection, where first works have their place every year.

Ikusmira Berriak and the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola are part of the Festival's desire to extend beyond its nine days and to increasingly become a **Festival that runs all year long**, which communicates – exploring its past, looking at its present, imagining its future – and conveys its knowledge and programme over twelve months by means of the public screen shared with other city institutions at Tabakalera.

But the Festival's biggest challenges don't eclipse other, more everyday factors which are nevertheless fundamental. In view of the problems with its ticket sales, the Festival continues to explore possibilities in order to guarantee an effective system.

Lastly, the Festival can't ignore the times in which it lives. As a follow-up to its pledge made last year, **during 2019** the Festival **compiled statistics on the gender identity** of the participating filmmakers and has become one of the first festivals to publish an X-ray of women's participation in the audiovisual industry. Based on the reading and dissemination of these figures, we hope to promote active reflection taking a deeper look at our society from a critical and feminist point of view.

New Directors

All of the films in this section compete for the Kutxabank-New Directors Award, coming with 50,000 euros distributed in equal parts between the director and the distributor of the film in Spain.

The Kutxabank-New Directors Award is sponsored by Kutxabank, an official Festival collaborator. The Jury of the Kutxabank-New Directors Award has the task of appraising and granting the awards to these films.

Films in the New Directors section are also candidates for the TCM Youth Award, decided by a jury of 136 students between the ages of 18 and 15 years.

Horizontes Latinos

Selection of the year's best feature films, as yet unscreened in Spain, totally or partially produced in Latin America, either directed by filmmakers of Latin origin or set against a backdrop or theme of Latin communities in other parts of the world.

All of the films in the Horizontes Latinos section compete for the Horizontes Award, coming with 35,000 euros, 10,000 of which go to the director of the film and 25,000 to its distributor in Spain.

The Jury of the Horizontes Award has the task of appraising these films and deciding the awards. Films in the Horizontes Selection which are the first or second works by their director also compete for the TCM Youth Award, decided by a jury of 136 students between the ages of 18 and 25 years.



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Zabaltegi-Tabakalera

Zabaltegi-Tabakalera is San Sebastian Festival's all-encompassing competitive section, where there are neither rules nor limits as to style or runtime: short, medium-length, feature, fiction, non-fiction or animated films, series, audiovisual installations, future discoveries and contemporary classics as yet unseen in Spain. This is a section for films daring to try new angles and formats, a true open and high-risk zone.





The selected short films are screened at showings open to the public. A prestigious filmmaker presides over the jury of the section and, together with the students, chooses the winning film, recipient of the Nest Film Students best short film award, sponsored by Orona Fundazioa.

Nest Film Students is organised in collaboration with the Tabakalera International Centre for Contemporary Culture and is part of the legacy of Donostia/San Sebastian European Capital of Culture 2016.

Retrospective Roberto Gavaldón

Filmoteca Española and the San Sebastian Festival organised, in collaboration with Filmoteca Vasca and the San Telmo Museum, a retrospective dedicated to Roberto Gavaldón, accompanied by a monographic book dedicated to the Mexican filmmaker, published by Filmoteca Española and the San Sebastian Festival.

Roberto Gavaldón (1909-1986) is considered to have been one of Mexican cinema's most important directors in the fifties and sixties. Born in Jiménez, in the Mexican state of Chihuahua, in 1909, he took his first steps in the medium working as an extra, actor, assistant director and scriptwriter. After a few jobs as co-director, he made his solo debut in 1945 with *La barraca (The Plot of Land)*, adaptation of the novel by Vicente Blasco Ibáñez, with a production team including several Spanish technicians who had gone into exile in Mexico after the Civil War.

Already from that first feature film, Gavaldón made his mark with a highly sober, classic and realist style, benefitting from the collaboration with directors of photography such as Gabriel Figueroa, Alex Phillips and Jack Draper. He generally dealt with melodramatic topics. Both his style and the chosen storylines would later make him clash with the younger crop of critics and directors who questioned his predilection for national cinema.

Macario (1960), based on a story by Ben Traven – a writer who also gave John Huston his inspiration for *The Treasure of the Sierra Madre*, and whom Gavaldón would adapt once again in *Rosa blanca* (1961) and *Dias de otoño* (*Autumn Days*, 1963) – is one of his most important films: it participated in the Cannes Festival and was the first Mexican film to land an Academy Award nomination for best foreign language film. Its lead man, Ignacio López Tarso (one of the actors in Buñuel's *Nazarín*), was one of the stars of Mexican cinema in those years. Gavaldón also worked with other big names of Mexican cinema, such as María Félix, Dolores del Río, Arturo de Córdova and Pedro Armendáriz, as well as with Argentina's star of melodrama, Libertad Lamarque.

For years he was the leading representative of his country's cinema at the big international festivals. He competed several times in Cannes, Venice and Berlin, presenting *Acuérdate de vivir (Remember To Live)* at the first edition of the San Sebastian Festival in 1953. He won eight Ariel awards, the accolades given from 1947 by the Mexican Academy of Film Arts and Sciences: the first Ariel Award for best film went to *La barraca*.

FIPRESCI Grand Prix

ROMA was chosen as best film of 2019 by the members of the International Federation of Film Critics, FIPRESCI. The vote saw the participation of 618 critics worldwide, who chose this production from among all films released after 1 July 2018. The other finalists were *Dolor y Gloria (Pain and Glory), by Pedro Almodóvar, for which Antonio Banderas won the best actor award at Cannes, Gisaenchung / Parasite*, by Bong Joon-ho, Golden Palm at the Cannes Festival, which will participate in Perlak, and *The Favourite*, by Yorgos Lanthimos, winner of an award at Venice 2018 and for which Olivia Colman won the Academy Award for Best Actress.

This is the first time Alfonso Cuarón has received the accolade. The Fipresci Grand Prix is the latest recognition of *ROMA*, which premiered at the Venice Festival and participated in Perlak in 2018. Over the months, the film has harvested a never-ending list of awards: Golden Lion in Venice, Academy Award for best foreign language film, director, photography, BAFTA for best film, best film not in the English language and cinematography, ten Ariel Awards, Goya for best Iberoamerican film and seven Platino Awards, among others.

Since its creation in 1999, the Fipresci Grand Prix has gone to prestigious filmmakers including Pedro Almodóvar, Michael Haneke, Cristian Mungiu, Jean-Luc Godard, Richard Linklater, Roman Polanski, George Miller, Maren Ade, Aki Kaurismäki and Paul Thomas Anderson, among others.

Industry Department

The **FESTIVAL'S INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT** provides all industry professionals with the means and activities to make their stay in San Sebastian as productive and satisfactory as possible. It also assists the crews of films selected for the Festival: producers, distributors and sales agents.

Located in the Kursaal Centre, the Festival hub, The Industry Club has the necessary facilities to optimise the work of its accredited guests. The **industry pass** enables their admission to the following activities and services: Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum; Films in Progress; Glocal in Progress; Zinemaldia & Technology; Lau Haizetara Documentary Co-Production Forum; other activities including conferences and round tables; and services such as the lending of spaces for professional meetings, access to the online area for professionals on the Festival website (industry attendees and contacts for the selected films), as well as several work and meeting areas.

In 2019 the Festival issued accreditations to 4,319 professionals, of whom **1,749 were industry guests** from 1,209 companies in 62 countries. The presence of these professionals represents a rise of 3% compared to 2018 and a sustained increase of more than 77.7% with respect to 2010.

By geographical area, 1,423 of the professional attendees came from Europe (81.3%), 223 from Latin America (12.7%) and 93 from other territories (5.3%). 954 professionals came from the Spanish territory, 171 of whom were from the Basque Country.

New Features In 2019

For this edition, the Industry Department presented a series of new features in its activities with the aim of enabling collaboration between professionals:

The Festival and New Technologies

Zinemaldia & Technology, an industry activity created in 2018, saw the introduction of a Europe-wide competition, the Zinemaldia Startup Challenge. Promoted by the Basque Government Department of Economic Development and Infrastructures, this is an initiative devised to foster new entrepreneurial and technological innovation projects applied to the audiovisual field.

Zinemaldia & Technology is a strategic commitment by the San Sebastian Festival which aims to position itself as a space of reference for obtaining first-hand knowledge of the new technological advances, their potential applications and the opportunities generated in the field of both audiovisual creation and business. This activity sponsored by Petronor is jointly organised by the Festival, Tecnalia and Tabakalera, and has the collaboration of Vicomtech, and of Creative Europe MEDIA.

International Leadership of Spanish Series

This space looks at the phenomenon of series and their relevance in audiovisual creativity and production. At this edition, VOD platforms such as Amazon, HBO, Movistar+ and Netflix met to discuss the new golden age of Spanish series and their opportunities in the world market.

European Film Forum

The San Sebastian Festival jointly organised with Creative Europe MEDIA a Conference dedicated to new models of funding and collaboration for promoting European cinema. The conference took place in the framework of the European Film Forum, the platform for a structured dialogue between policy makers and the stakeholders in the audiovisual sector set in motion by the European Commission in 2015.

Focus on Poland

The Focus on is an industry initiative launched in 2014 with the Focus on Canada, when a group of professionals from that country was invited to San Sebastian in collaboration with Telefilm Canada, in order that they could discover the Festival first hand, increase their network of professional contacts and participate in the Industry activities.

In 2019 the *Focus on* was dedicated to Poland. Thanks to the collaboration of the Polish Film Institute, ten Polish producers with projects attended the Festival to increase their co-production opportunities with other regions of Europe and Latin America and to participate in a presentation on financing, talent and co-production opportunities with Poland.

VIII Europe-Latin America Co-production Forum

September 22, 23, 24 and 25. San Telmo Museum

The Co-Production Forum is a platform for presenting projects at the development stage from Europe and Latin America. The heads of the 16 selected projects presented their work to accredited industry guests at pitching sessions and had a personalised agenda of meetings with the professionals interested in their projects.

The Forum has its headquarters in the San Telmo Museum. The Cloister was set up as a networking area where the industry guests could arrange meetings. It was also the setting for the Happy Hours laid on for the attendees. The projects presented had an individual space for one-to-one meetings with industry professionals.

As sidebar activities, Conferences, Round tables and Presentations were organised in the Function Room, where professionals exchanged experiences and discussed questions of interest including the latest trends in the audiovisual world, co-productions, distribution and new business models.

Focus on Poland

In the framework of the Forum, the Industry Department organises the *Focus on*, an initiative whereby a group of professionals from a country, region or territory come to the San Sebastian Festival to increase their network of professional contacts and participate in the Industry activities.

This year, thanks to the collaboration of the Polish Film Institute, ten producers with projects from Poland attended the Festival to increase their opportunities of co-production with other European and Latin American regions.

Advisory services on internationalisation for Basque projects

Yet another year, in collaboration with the Festival, the Creative Europe Desk Euskadi - Zineuskadi organised an advisory service for film projects with an International vocation. An initiative for producers with feature film projects at the development and/or filming stage, giving them a solid starting point for the internationalisation of their projects and the search for new partners at the 67th edition of the Festival.

This year, the advice was provided by Paulo Roberto Carvalho, a Brazilian producer based in Germany with long and proven experience in coproductions between Germany and Latin America. The advisory was held from 18 to 20 June, to finish with its implementation during the Festival of San Sebastian. His task was to provide guidance for the selected professionals on the internationalisation of their projects, the search for partners and funding.

Sponsors and Collaborators

The VIII Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum was possible thanks to the sponsorship of the Basque Government Department of Economic Development and Infrastructures and the support of Creative Europe MEDIA. 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V. Ikusmira Berriak

Jointly organised by Tabakalera International Centre for Contemporary Culture, San Sebastian Festival and the recently created Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola, Ikusmira Berriak is a programme of support for the development of audiovisual projects focussing on the innovation and experimentation of film language and production means.

It has the principal objective to promote audiovisual creation, articulating its programme around two areas: training and production. Ikusmira Berriak offers a sixweek residency for creative development, a grant for starting production and a programme of support for postproduction in the shape of an award.

The programme, which celebrated its fifth edition this year, ended with active participation of the project heads in the VIII Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum, both for the pitching session on Sunday 22 September and for the one-to-one meetings organised over the following days with professionals interested in their projects.

To learn first-hand about the new technological advances, their possible applications and the opportunities generated in the fields of both creation and business, in 2018 the San Sebastian Festival, Tecnalia, Tabakalera and Petronor joined forces to launch an event seeking to promote a coming together between the film world and IT innovation.

In its second edition, Zinemaldia & Technology included a masterclass, presentations by R&D&I companies and pitching by the projects selected for the *Zinemaldia Startup Challenge*, a competition promoted by the Basque Government Department of Economic Development and Infrastructures, aimed at entrepreneurs and recently created startups with new business projects based on the application of digital technologies to the audiovisual field. Collaborations With Institutions And Professional International Networks

Ventana Sur - Proyecta

The year 2018 saw an increase in the collaboration between the San Sebastian Festival and Ventana Sur, Latin America's biggest film market, organised by the Marché du Film-Festival de Cannes and the INCAA (Argentine National Institute of Cinema and Audiovisual Arts), with the setting in motion of Proyecta (Ventana Sur – Buenos Aires).

Proyecta involves the presentation of projects seeking international partners, co-producers and sales agents. This initiative, created to promote co-productions in Latin America and with Europe, is organised jointly by Ventana Sur and the San Sebastian Festival.

The 2019 selection is made up of twelve projects from Latin America, selected by Paulo Roberto de Carvalho, Esperanza Luffiego (on behalf of the Festival) and Clara Massot; it also includes two Brazilian projects from the Taller EAVE Puentes-Europe/Latin America Coproduction Workshop and Brazil CineMundi. Completing the selection are four European projects participating in San Sebastian Festival's VIII Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum.

European Film Promotion

In the framework of this collaboration, 6 European producers from its *Producers On the Move* programme with an interest in Latin America were invited to participate in the VIII Europe-Latin America Co-Production Forum.

Europa Distribution

Europa Distribution (Network of Independent European Film Distributors) and the San Sebastian Festival have signed a collaboration agreement under which some 20 members from the association gathered in San Sebastian for their workshop, held from September 23-25.

Moreover, Europa Distribution organised a round table in the framework of the VIII Forum: *The 'Holy Grial' of right holders*: The availability and visibility of European Films on VoD platforms

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Film Library

The Festival Film Library offered accredited Industry professionals the opportunity to view in streaming mode films from among those selected in all of the Festival sections, and which had been registered by their representatives, for up to a month after the end of the event (October 28, 2019). The Festival Video Library is operated by CinandoVL, the platform for film industry professionals created by the Marché du Film – Festival de Cannes.

The Festival Film Library also includes an overview of films from Spain and Latin America.

The platform was available from September 20, the Festival opening date, until October 28, exactly a month after it closed. During this period there were **2,114 viewings** of the **103 films** submitted.



Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola

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Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola

Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola (EQZE) is an international centre for thinking, research, experimental practice and pedagogical innovation focussed on the past, present and future of cinema, created by the Provincial Council of Gipuzkoa in 2017. The three EQZE post-graduate itineraries: Film Curating, Film Preservation and Filmmaking, stem from the fields of knowledge of the three stakeholders participating in its conceptualisation: the San Sebastian Festival, the Filmoteca Vasca and the Tabakalera cultural project. The school has its headquarters in the Tabakalera International Centre for Contemporary Culture, which is also home to the aforementioned institutions.

The unique nature of its origins and location, of its approach to the cinema and of its teaching project make this a centre of international scale. In fact, the second group of students to begin their studies at the EQZE in September come from countries including Argentina, Australia, Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Finland, Italy, Mexico, Peru, Portugal, South Korea, United States, and Uruguay. Among the 45 people selected for the 2019/2020 academic year are filmmakers with works released and to have won awards at festivals or which have shown in galleries; students trained at other film and art schools all over the world; graduates in multiple cultural disciplines, specialists in the world of film production and distribution; curators with experience in production, management and programming, researchers, professionals from the world of photography and design...

The Festival participates in the EQZE as a member of its Academic Board, also teaching a subject (Festival Under Construction) designed to rethink the event together with students and professionals such as Thierry Frémaux, Carlo Chatrian, Vincent Maraval, Paolo Moretti, Jérome Paillard, Ilse Hughan, Domingo Corral, Chiara Marañón, Rosa Ferré, Garbiñe Ortega, Esther García, Leire Apellaniz and Marian Fernández, helping to develop the students' projects through programmed tutorials, or offering them accreditations and specific professional itineraries during the Festival.

The Festival's participation, both in conceptualising the EQZE and as a member of its Academic Board, corresponds to a general strategic commitment to becoming an international reference as a platform for the training, project development and professionalisation of filmmakers.

A festival running for 365 days in Tabakalera

To understand this strategic commitment, we must look at the context of the San Sebastian Festival: the building housing its offices is also home to the institutions which are our travelling companions in this undertaking: the Tabakalera cultural programme, the Filmoteca Vasca and the EQZE itself.

These institutions jointly organise the Nest section (the International Film Students Meeting), as well as the Ikusmira Berriak residencies programme, the development of its projects and the aforementioned conceptualisation and setting in motion of the EQZE.

But the overlapping and collaborations between the institutions don't stop there: they touch on cinema programmes throughout the year, turning the Festival into an event lasting for all 365 days of the year.

On the one hand, the Tabakalera cinema has a public screen shared by the institutions in which the Festival participates with its Zabaltegi Tabakalera screenings (also in its extended version going by the name of Zabaltegi Tabakalera Plus) and with the Nest short films. But these synergies also affect the guests: filmmakers and professionals who give tutorials, masterclasses, workshops or visits shared by the institutions. Lastly, the Festival, Tabakalera, EQZE and the Filmoteca Vasca also join forces to carry out research related to cinematography, such as the Festival's *Zinemaldia 70. All possible stories* archive or *Zine*, the publication on research into Basque cinema.

In 2019, when the EQZE has only been in existence for a year, the University of the Basque Country has recognised the EQZE post-graduate courses as master's degrees with an equivalent academic value and, where appropriate, the same professional effects as those actually taught at the University.

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Zinemaldia 70. All Possible Stories

How many stories do seven decades in the life of an international film festival have to tell? How can we reencounter the memory and the material traces of the myriad cinematic, political, social and personal aspects that have shaped the San Sebastian Festival since its foundation in 1953?

The San Sebastian Festival has created, together with the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola (EQZE) research department, the project Zinemaldi 70: all possible stories (Z70) with a view to generating a living Festival archive. The first stage of the project will culminate in 2022, coinciding with the Festival's 70th anniversary. The initiative has the collaboration of Tabakalera-International Centre for Contemporary Culture and the sponsorship of Loterías y Apuestas del Estado.

The Z70 project will highlight the importance of the Festival's document collections (letters, photographs, reviews and articles in newspapers and magazines, books, etc.), stored in its archive since 1953. The core objective of the project is to prompt reflection and discussion on the past, present and future of the Festival, as well as dialogues critical with cinematic creation and contemporary thought.

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Zinemaldia 70. All Possible Stories

The project involves transferring all of the Festival's archive material to the Tabakalera building, where it will be examined, prepared and catalogued to guarantee its conservation in the Filmoteca Vasca facilities. In 2022, the archive will be available for public consultation either physically or online, through a selection of digitized contents. Consultation of the collection will include themed spotlights based on the research developed by a team of post-graduate students at the Elías Querejeta Zine Eskola directed by the researcher Pablo La Parra Pérez in collaboration with the different Festival Departments.

The research spotlights will stress little known or unknown aspects of the Festival's history. To reveal its results until 2022, two lines of work will proceed simultaneously and in connection with one another. On the one hand, specialised research material (academic articles, presentations at congresses, own editorial projects, seminars, etc.) will be generated in the endeavour to create a critical dialogue with the latest developments in the academic field of film studies. On the other hand, a number of public programmes will be organised (conferences, exhibitions, courses), aimed at wider publics. On December 7 the Festival began sharing its archive with citizens thanks to the project's first public event, held in the Tabakalera cinema, looking at the transformation experienced by the Festival in the early years of the Transition, converted into a laboratory of cinematic and political experimentation in a context of intense social struggle. The EQZE student body, led by Pablo La Parra, recovered experiences such as the work of the Barrios v Pueblos Committee or the season of films made by women which in 1978 brought to San Sebastian female directors including Věra Chytilová, Larisa Shepitko, Agnès Varda, Cecilia Bartolomé and Vivian Ostrovsky - with the last two meeting again in the city 41 years down the line together with the San Sebastian Women's Assembly, organisers of the initiative. Dialogue was also established between the past and present with the screening of Expediente, directed by Carlos Rodríguez Sanz and Manuel Coronado, recognised with the Golden Shell for Best Short Film in 1977, and the performative screening by filmmakers Luis López Carrasco and Raúl Liarte.





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
