Introduction

65 DONOSTIA ZINEMALDIA FESTIVAL DE SAN SEBASTIAN

The 65th Festival was characterised by a particularly positive reception for the films not only among the public but also among the local and international media and critics and by the sustained growth in the presence of the film industry at San Sebastián.

In 2017 three Donostia Awards were presented, which represent the start of a change in the

model: as well as actors and actresses, directors, cinematographers or composers will also receive the most important honorary award at the San Sebastián Festival in the next few years. Along with the actors Ricardo Darín and Monica Bellucci, whose ceremony was held for the first time at the Velodrome, the artistic contribution made by the French filmmaker, Agnès Varda, a legend of European cinema who received the award at the Victoria Eugenia Theatre, was also recognised. Together with these, a significant number of stars on the international scene like Javier Bardem, Steve Coogan, Glenn Close, Penélope Cruz, James Franco, Jean-Pierre Léaud, Sarah Miles, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Christian Slater, Melanie Thierry, the Jaeger-LeCoultre Latin Cinema award-winner Paz Vega, or Alicia Vikander came to present their films. The actor, director and producer John Malkovich also chaired the Official Jury.

Furthermore, prestigious directors such as Raymond Depardon, Ildikó Enyedi, Robert Guédiguian, Todd Haynes, Aki Kaurismäki, Hirokazu Koreeda, Ruben Östlund, Lynne Ramsay, Carlos Saura, Nobuhiro Suwa, Wim Wenders, Michael Winterbottom or Frederick Wiseman accompanied their latest films at the Festival. The number of accredited visitors continues to increase due to the continuous growth of Industry, which this year began a new activity, Glocal in Progress, which focuses on European cinema made in non-hegemonic languages. The number of journalists, on the other hand, went down slightly. The Festival is not immune to changes in the model with regard to communication and is adopting measures in this respect: on the one hand, it has made an effort to tell its own story better, through television, the web page, social networks and the newspaper of the Festival itself; on the other hand, next year it will be organising the First International Critics' Meeting, where they will be encouraging reflection on the relationship between festivals and the media.

The Festival continues to show its commitment to new talents. New Directors and the Film Students' Meeting are clear evidence of this. However, from 2018 onwards it will also form part of the Steering Committee and the Academic Management of the Elías Querejeta Film School, a school that has been promoted and launched by Gipuzkoa Provincial Council.

However, the figure that probably best defines the character of the Festival is the number of people who go and watch the films each year. In 2017 once again more than 174,000 cinema tickets were sold in a city with a population of 186,000 people..

Retrospective

Joseph Losey

In the seventies, Joseph Losey represented the greatest expression of *auteur* or art-house cinema with works like *The Servant* (1963), *King and Country* (1964), *Accident* (1967) and *The Go-Between* (1971). But before becoming a leading figure of European independent film, Losey endured a complicated situation like so many others affected by the reprisals of the Hollywood witch hunt from 1947 onwards. His work is divided into three periods: his early period in North American film until the early fifties, the prestige he achieved in the UK of the sixties and seventies and a later, more itinerant stage when he worked for Italian, French and Spanish production.

The Industry Club

The Industry Department of the Festival, The Industry Club

has provided all the industry professionals with the means and activities to ensure that their stay in San Sebastián was as productive and satisfactory as possible. To do this they have the **industry accreditation** that has given them access to the services and initiatives programmed by The Industry Club, as well as enabling them to attend the films programmed in the Festival.

In 2017 3,911 professionals were accredited at the Festival, of whom **1,621 are accredited industry professionals**, from 1,087 companies spread among 60 countries. The presence of these professionals represents a 3.3% increase with respect to 2016 and a sustained increase of more than 64% with respect to 2010.

By geographical area, 1,291 professionals attended from Europe (79.6%), 152 from Latin America (9.4%) and 178 from other territories (11%). 872 professionals come from Spain, 166 of whom are from the Basque Country.

NEW FEATURES 2017

At this year's Festival, The Industry Club came up with a series of new features in its activities with the aim of facilitating collaboration among professionals:

The VI Europe-Latin America Coproduction Forum had an extra day dedicated to *pitching sessions*, which increased the possibilities of personalised meetings for the sixteen projects in development that were presented. Furthermore, for the first time, the four projects selected in the Ikusmira Berriak residencies programme organised by the Festival and Tabakalera had a space of their own at San Telmo and an agenda of one-to-one meetings.

In parallel to this, from the 25th to the 27th of September the films were screened that had been selected for Films in Progress 32 and the first year of Glocal in Progress, the new initiative created to give greater visibility to European films made in non-hegemonic languages. The documentation for the projects and films presented in these four activities are listed in a single publication which has been conceived as a useful tool for professionals. Over these days, San Telmo was the meeting point for industry members present in San Sebastián. Professionals had spaces where they could meet and exchange experiences by taking part in other activities such as presentations and round tables. For the first time, in 2017 a complementary pass was introduced to give buyers priority access to press and industry screenings.

The Industry Club has a network of collaborators who help its activities. This year the **MEET THEM!** Space has been included in the professional area of the Festival Web page where the professionals who have attended the Festival through agreements by The Industry Club with film institutions have been listed. Furthermore, international organisations like Eurimages and audio-visual companies like Film Factory presented new prizes to consolidate the professional activities at the San Sebastián Festival as a benchmark for European and Latin American cinema as far as the international industry is concerned.

VI Europe-Latin America Co-production Forum

REPORT

The Coproduction Forum is a platform for presenting projects at the development stage in both Europe and Latin America. The representatives of the 16 selected projects presented them at a pitching session to industry members and held a personalised round of meetings with professionals interested in taking part in their projects.

The San Telmo Museum Cloister was fitted out as a networking area set up so that industry pass holders could arrange meetings. In this space breakfasts, lunches and Happy Hours were provided for those present.

At the same time, in the Function Room Round tables and Presentations were programmed in which professionals exchanged experiences and addressed matters of interest such as the latest trends in the audio-visual world, co-productions, distribution and new business models.
